Additional English and Maths teachers have been employed in order to ensure smaller class sizes and improved teaching in those subjects. Improvement in these core areas will flow into all other subjects and help every pupil make the most of their learning experience both in and out of school.	Salary costs £71,027

Ofsted inspected the school in November 2014 and said: “The pupil premium funding is used effectively, particularly to raise literacy standards across the school.
